
DEFORESTATION AND LAND USE POLICY

Introduction

Domino's Pizza Group's (DPG) purpose of delivering a better future through food people love ensures we are committed to sourcing our products responsibly, preserving our planet's forests, and ensuring sustainable production practices across our supply chain.

Our ambition is for zero deforestation and forest land conversion within priority commodities by the end of 2025. We are committed to working with suppliers who demonstrate responsible land management practices and actively support local communities affected by deforestation and forest land use change. As with all areas of sustainability, DPG prioritises constant improvement and transparent monitoring of progress. This policy aligns with our broader environmental and modern slavery commitments and will be continually updated to reflect emerging best practices and regulations.

Scope

DPG has identified five priority products which we are actively focusing on:

- Palm oil
- Soy – including as animal feed
- Cocoa
- Wood – including non-recycled pulp and paper products
- Beef

Our Actions

Palm oil

- Where possible, palm oil has been removed from DPG products. Where it is necessary, DPG mandates the use of certified palm oil (from RSPO or similar).

Soy

- All soy used in primary products must be certified deforestation-free. All soy used in processing products or animal feed must be traceable to non-deforestation-associated regions.

Cocoa

- All our cocoa suppliers are working to ensure maximum transparency down to the farm level.

Wood

- All non-recycled pulp and paper products in customer packaging are FSC-certified.

Beef

- All beef sourced from EU sources that are in scope of EUDR, we are working to ensure they are compliant with all deforestation regulations.

Governance

DPG is working hard to do business the right way. Delivering a better future through food people love ensures that we operate sustainably for future generations. Part of this vision is ensuring that we promote sustainability not only to minimise risk but to improve the lives of the people, communities and environments we operate in.

As part of our deforestation and land use commitments, we commit to the following:

Transparent reporting

- DPG will continue to report our sustainability progress annually and to frameworks such as CDP Forest.

Continuous monitoring

- DPG regularly touches base with our key ingredient suppliers to discuss their environmental and social practices.

Improving together

- DPG will work collaboratively with suppliers, governments, industry-partners, and communities to ensure we are addressing deforestation and land-use change issues in the best way possible.
- DPG is committed to respecting the human rights of Indigenous People, local communities, workers and other communities who are impacted by DPG operations.

Responding to grievances

- DPG will manage and monitor our supply chain to identify non-compliance and resolve any incidences of non-compliance with this and other policies as quickly and effectively as possible.
